NAPLAN 2024 parent and carer information Suggested school newsletter or email content

Each year the National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) is undertaken by students in Years 3, 5, 7 and 9. Students will participate in tests for writing, reading, conventions of language (spelling, grammar and punctuation) and numeracy.

NAPLAN 2024 will take place from Wednesday 13 March to Monday 25 March.

NAPLAN is just one part of our school learning assessment program. The tests assess literacy and numeracy skills your child is already learning at school.

In preparation for NAPLAN, our school will undertake activities to help students become familiar with the format and functionality of the online tests. These activities are not an assessment of student ability and will not be marked. Excessive preparation for NAPLAN is not required nor recommended.

The <u>public demonstration site</u> (<u>https://www.nap.edu.au/online-assessment/public-demonstration-site</u>) is available to see the types of questions, tools and functions used in the NAPLAN tests.

SUSTAINABILITY



We have started up all our sustainable systems in these first few weeks of Term 1. All students deposit their empty 10cent return drink containers into blue bins around the school and The Green Team is sorting and recycling for our Return and Earn program. The Green Team is watering gardens and caring for our sensory path area under the Heritage Tree in our Year 1 area. Year 5 students are feeding, watering and collecting eggs up in the chicken coop.

All classes are sending their food scraps up to our 3Bay compost area and Year 6 students are adding Carbon to the Nitrogen for what we hope will be a highly productive compost!

The Bush Tucker Garden has had some impressive growth over the summer and students are helping with weeding, watering and a general post-summer tidy up.

We are looking forward to new projects in sustainability at EBPS this year. We have received a T4L STEM



kit consisting of 2 Aeroponics Garden Towers. Students in Years 1-6 have planted seeds in the aeroponics system and in soil and they will compare growth rates and water usage. We are also really looking forward to welcoming the Black Soldier Fly back to EBPS! We will be receiving a BSF Life Cycle Kit from Arc Ento Tech and students will observe and compare life cycles. Students will discuss the resources and benefits we create when we divert organic waste from landfill using the Black Soldier Fly larvae.



LIBRARY

The Premier's Reading Challenge has begun!! The Premier's Reading Challenge aims to encourage a love of reading for leisure and pleasure in students, and to enable them to experience quality literature! Students in 3-6 will read their 20 books independently and will need to return their permission note in order to begin logging their readings. Students in K-2 will have their 30 books read to them during class and library sessions and will only need to return a note if you wish to withdraw your child from participating. At the end of the challenge, students that complete the required readings will receive a certificate. They may also have their name



appear on The Premier's Reading Challenge Honour Roll if they have completed 4-7 years of completion.

Borrowing in the library is in full swing! Please remember to send your child with a library bag on their allocated day so they can continue to borrow. If you have not already, please put your child's name on their bag to ensure it makes its way back to them if they lose it. Our borrowing limits are as follows:
