Aeroponics vs Soil

Our Scientific investigation into food sustainability and alternative growing methods is well on its way across Year 1 to Year 6. Students have planted cucumbers, snow peas, basil, lettuce and spinach in the Aeroponics tower and in soil and are making qualitative and quantitative observations. Our aim is to discover which method will perform better. We are following the steps of an observational investigation and learning how to collect and present data. Younger children are measuring using informal measurement and older children are creating reports, tables and graphs with formal measurement using a variety of technology platforms.

ADMINISTRATION

Medication at school

Parents/carers of children who require prescribed medication to be administered at school must complete a written request, this can be obtained from the front office.

In some cases, a medical practitioner may not write a prescription for a medication because it may be available 'over the counter'. NSW Health advises that 'over the counter' medication may still be harmful and that schools should follow the same procedures for non-prescribed medications as for prescribed medications, so we will require a written request and appropriate pharmacy packaging for this also. As winter is approaching, please check and update your child's/children's Asthma Plan and medication supplied at school.

Holidays and Leave

If you are taking your family on a holiday outside of school holidays and it will be 5 school days or longer, please be aware that as a government school we require a leave application to be completed including where you are going, the dates and any itinerary. This is Department of Education requirement. The principal will consider the application. If approved, we will issue your family with a certificate of extended leave.

Working with Children Declaration

If you are wishing to volunteer and assist in your own child's classroom or canteen, please see the office for a Working with Children declaration form.

Change of Arrangements

If you require to change the after school arrangements for your child/children, please ensure you contact the school by phone prior to 2pm to allow ample time to relay your information before the end of the school day.
