



#### EBPS Sustainability Leaders: Growing a Greener Future

This term, our dedicated Sustainability Leaders have embarked on an exciting journey to plan their Leadership Project, with guidance from the Rumbalara Environment Education Centre. Their mission? To inspire change and enhance sustainability at our school while educating fellow students at EBPS.

The leaders initially focused on two key areas: Biodiversity and Water Conservation. Through brainstorming sessions and discussions, they investigated a range of innovative projects. After careful consideration, two standout ideas emerged: the creation of a wildflower meadow at the back of our school to boost biodiversity, and the installation of a water refill station to replace some of our existing bubblers. A recent water audit revealed that bubblers were significant contributors to water wastage

However, challenges arose during the planning stages. Unfortunately, budget constraints prevented the immediate installation of the water refill station. Additionally, ongoing excavation work at the proposed site for the wildflower meadow hindered access. In light of these obstacles, our leaders have adapted their plans and are now in the step-by-step planning stage to construct a large wicking bed. This innovative gardening method allows for efficient water usage, making it an ideal solution for our sustainability goals. The wicking bed will also provide a perfect environment for seeding wildflowers, further enhancing biodiversity at our school.

This project will require extensive preparation and collaboration, as our leaders seek support from their peers to bring their vision to life. We are excited to see how this wicking bed project unfolds and look forward to sharing updates on our progress. Stay tuned for more news as we work together towards a greener future at EBPS!

#### **ADMINISTRATION**



#### Medication at school

Parents/carers of children who require prescribed medication to be administered at school must complete **a** written request, this can be obtained from the front office.

In some cases, a medical practitioner may not write a prescription for a medication because it may be available 'over the counter'. NSW Health advises that 'over the counter' medication may still be harmful and that schools should follow the same procedures for non-prescribed medications as for prescribed medications, so we will require a written request and appropriate pharmacy packaging for this also.

#### Holidays and Leave

If you are taking your family on a holiday outside of school holidays and it will be **5 school days or longer**, please be aware that as a government school we require a leave application to be completed including where you are going, the dates and any itinerary. This is Department of Education requirement. The principal will consider the application. If approved, we will issue your family with a certificate of extended leave.

#### Safety around the School

School grounds must be safe for all students, staff and visitors.

Just a reminder, please do not enter the staff parking areas to drop off or pick up your child after 7:30am or prior to 4pm. There is signposting on the road along both sides of Empire Bay Drive for stopping and parking, please only stop or park in these locations.

The bus bays are for turning around safely, please do not stop, drop off your child or park in that area.



#### Working with Children Check Declaration



If you are wishing to volunteer and assist in your own child's classroom or canteen, please see the office for a Working with Children declaration, these can now be completed electronically.

#### **Transporting Students**

Parents or close relative volunteers who take student to school activities are required to have completed a WWCC Declaration. The school needs to submit a verification request through our DoE system and be verified in the system before the excursion date. This process is only if students are collected from school and driven to an activity or event. Students that are taken directly to the destination prior to coming to school do not need to complete these steps.


